AI can do amazing things.

It can help doctors spot diseases early.

It can help scientists study space and predict the weather.

It can translate languages, compose music, and even help people who can't see by describing what's around them.

But what's really fascinating is that AI learns from the data people give it. It's like teaching a robot to think, one piece of information at a time.

But here's the tricky part.

AI isn't always right - because it learns from humans, and humans make mistakes. If AI is trained on wrong information, it can share things that aren't true or fair.

Sometimes, people even use AI to mislead others -to make fake pictures, videos, or voices.

When something online feels too surprising, too perfect, or too shocking, pause and check.

Here are a few clues something might not be real:

- Strange or blurred details in pictures (like odd hands, lighting or writing).
- Words that don't sound quite right.
- No trusted source or website.
- It makes you feel upset or pressured to share it fast.

Always pause, think, and check with an adult before believing or sharing.
