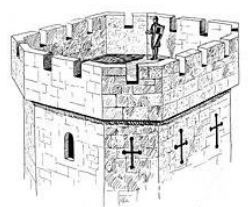
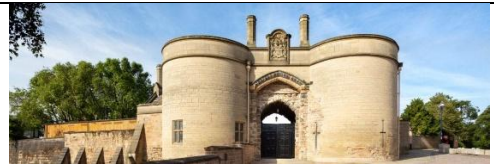


Word	Meaning	Picture	Word	Meaning	Picture
bailey	Is an inner courtyard in the middle of a castle.		legend	An old story that is widely believed but cannot be proved to be true.	
barbican	The outer defence of a castle.		moat	A deep wide ditch surrounding a castle. They are typically filled with water for protection from enemies.	
battlements	Battlements are square shaped parts of the wall around the top of the castle. They were used for firing arrows through the gaps.		physical properties	The features of a material.	
castle	A large building that has high walls with towers. They were built to protect against attack.		portcullis	A strong and heavy gate that can be lowered to stop enemies invading.	
drawbridge	Is used to get in and out of a castle.		Robin Hood	A Nottingham legend who took money from the rich to give it to the poor.	
knight	A mounted soldier in armour.		tower	A place in the castle that was used to lookout from and defend the castle.

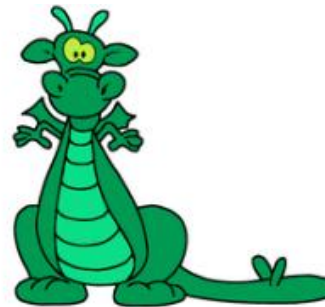
Key Facts and Dates:
