













Key Vocabulary Glossary:

climate	Climate is like the weather, but over a long time.		map	A map is a picture or drawing of a place. Maps may show features, such as rivers and lakes, forests, buildings, and roads.	
continent	A continent is a large solid area of land. Earth has seven continents		season	A few months with similar weather conditions and natural changes.	
equator	An equator is an imaginary line around the middle of a planet. It is halfway between the North Pole and the South Pole.		stability	How balanced and strong something is.	
globe	A round model of the earth used like a map.		structure	A building or object made up of different parts.	
foundations	The supporting structure of a building.		weather	The current atmospheric pressure.

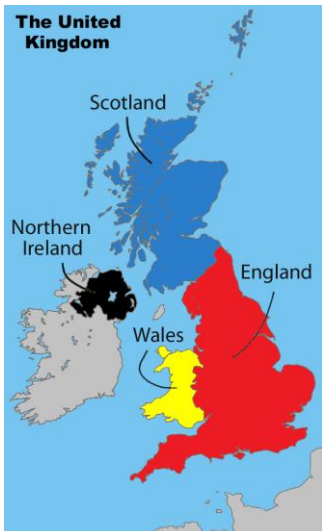
